Charter

Purpose

- The Regional Clean Transportation Coalition is a voluntary group of public, private, and academic participants interested in the emergence of clean energy technologies and low or no emission transportation modes. The coalition includes staff from local government agencies (cities, county, state) and transportation and utility service providers. It acts as a coordinating body to follow the dynamic changes in transportation propulsion systems and relevant policies and programs at the federal, state, and local level. The group is open to all interested stakeholders in the greater Spokane region, periodically meeting in a virtual format. It envisions progress toward clean transportation, through:
 - Planning, collaboration, transparency, and ongoing communication
 - Understanding industry trends and governmental policy
 - Effectively competing for public and private funding sources to accomplish shared goals and projects
 - Outreach and education among coalition participants and their stakeholders
 - Leveraging partnerships and our collective resources as a region

Outcomes

- The coalition aims to ensure regional and local agencies and utilities can share information and cooperatively plan for the benefits of cleaner transportation technologies, such as battery electric vehicles, alternative fuels, and integration of all low or no emission transportation modes. Potential desired outcomes include:
 - Grant awards to facilitate efficient development of infrastructure
 - Partnerships and cost sharing
 - Fuel and maintenance cost savings
 - Reduced tailpipe emissions and improved air quality for residents
 - Improved climate resiliency
 - Economic development
